In this exhibition, we will introduce Gogh to become one of the leading Impressionist painters through various encounters such as the Hague, the roots of Gogh's paintings, and the Impressionists, who had a great influence on him.

## The highlight of the exhibition

### Quiet “Hague” and dynamic “Impressionism” — two encounters that changed Van Gogh’s life

Vincent van Gogh (1853-1890), a painter who continues to fascinate people with intense colors. Of the short life of 37 years, only 10 years have been active as a painter. Despite the short art work, there were two big encounters behind the background that was able to acquire a unique expression.

The Hague School first led Van Gogh, who decided to live as a painter at the age of 27. Van Gogh learned the basics of being a painter from those who drew rural life with a quiet stroke. The Hague School, which has had few opportunities to focus on its relationship with Van Gogh, has played a very important role in Van Gogh's painting. Van Gogh then went to Paris and met the “Impressionist” and became fascinated by the vibrant colors.



In this exhibition, in addition to about 40 Van Gogh works, about 30 works by masters representing the Hague and Impressionists such as Maufe, Cezanne and Monet, and the words that Van Gogh spoke in the letter Then, I will delve into the process of arriving at the original style of painting.

How did Van Gogh become Van Gogh? Take a look at the short but dense 10 years led by two encounters.
